

Guidelines for how long an animal survey for State-listed species in Virginia is valid

If a survey, however old, has a positive species occurrence, further coordination with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries will be required. This list provides a general guideline for how long a negative survey (a survey where no listed species was found) remains valid. These timeframes provide general recommendations; site-specific circumstances may require that these general guidelines be modified. For Federally-listed species, the U. S. Fish and Wildlife also must be contacted.
